

Zika infection is associated with Congenital Zika Syndrome, which includes features like microcephaly (abnormally small heads and brains) in babies.1

Prevent bites insect repellent; long-sleeved shirts, pants; eliminate standing water; close windows.

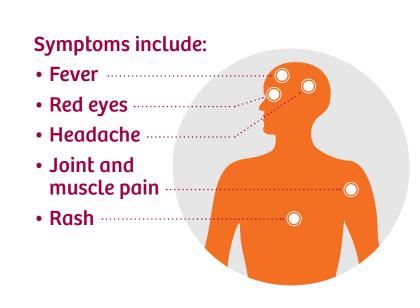
Do not travel to infected countries if pregnant or trying to get pregnant.

Protect yourself during sex.

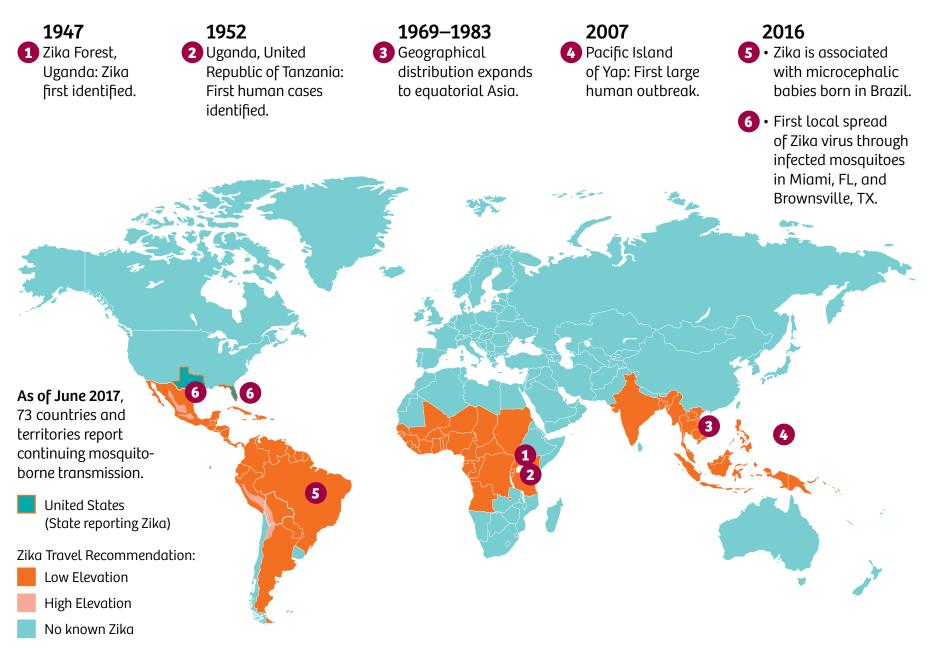
Symptoms¹

- The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) recommends testing of individuals including pregnant women at risk for Zika virus infection.1
