

From China for Germany: Siemens Healthineers donates protective material against COVID-19

Siemens Healthineers supports in the Corona crisis a flight of relief supplies from China to Germany organized by the German Federal Government with a donation of 55,000 respiratory masks, 5,000 medical protective suits and 600 safety goggles. The 216 packages of relief supplies have already been handed over to a forwarding company near Shanghai, where they are waiting to be transported to Germany within the next few days. Once they have arrived there, the German Federal Ministry of Health will centrally coordinate the distribution – to where the material is needed most urgently.
